Dear Mr. O'Malley:

On the 22nd day of August, 1955, the members of the Los Angeles City Council unanimously voted to telegraph you as follows:

"CITY COUNCIL LOS ANGELES TODAY UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED MOTION THAT THE PRESIDENT OF YOUR ORGANIZATION BE ADVISED LOS ANGELES IS SERIOUSLY INTERESTED IN MAKING A HOME FOR A MAJOR LEAGUE CLUB AND THE COUNCIL WOULD APPRECIATE YOUR VISITING LOS ANGELES FOR A SERIOUS CONFERENCE AND INSPECTION OF OUR FACILITIES."

As of this date, we have not received any reply to this wire.

The Los Angeles City Council is the official governing body for the City of Los Angeles. On numerous occasions the City Council has voiced its interest in obtaining a major league baseball club for the local populous. Councilman Roybal and I feel that in time major league ball will be played here. We are merely desirous of speeding up the progress.

On September 20, and for the week thereafter, my colleague, Councilman Edward R. Roybal and I, will be in New York at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel on official business. We have been authorized by the Los Angeles City Council to discuss the matter with you for the purpose of bringing recommendations back to them.

We are writing a similar letter to Mr. Horace Stoneham as we have been informed that your club and the New York Giants are both interested in studying the advantages of a new location for your respective ball clubs. In order that we may make the necessary plans, we would very much appreciate a prompt reply.
