I want you to know that I appreciate all the time and attention you and George gave to our matter yesterday. We might not be in agreement on some points but we, at least, get a kick out of fighting.

Do me one further favor and have George show you the map in front of the brochure entitled "Brooklyn Stadium Atlantic Avenue Site". You will note that the part shaded in yellow is railroad property. The portion in blue is occupied by the Ft. Greene market. The article that I mentioned at the meeting appeared on the front page of the Brooklyn Section of the New York World Telegram August 2, 1955, and was entitled "Market Dealers Hit Conditions in Old Market". The property on South Elliot Place and Hansen Place shaded in red would also be needed. This property for the most part, is occupied as living quarters. The section of the map at Atlantic and Flatbush Avenues shaded in red would also be needed but more to eliminate the traffic bottleneck at that intersection than for the purpose of the stadium. The stadium instead of being circular could perhaps be pear shaped thus eliminating that particular part of the property.

If you get any further ideas I know you will let me have them but in the meantime we will wait and see what reactions John Cashmore brings back from his executive session with the Board of Estimate.
