
Dear Walter:

I have your letter of the 18th and by this time you probably have heard from Bob Moses.

There is nothing we can do, so far as the Triborough Bridge and Tunnel Authority is concerned; in fact, it was a stretch for us to get the law amended to take care of the Coliseum.

I am not inclined to believe that Bob will go along with the idea, because, with the City struggling to assemble as much funds as it can for slum clearance and other public improvements, I don't think you would find members of the Board of Estimate sympathetic to using any Government grant for the construction of a ball park at this time.
